

Leaving a gift to George's

Adding a codicil to your Will

You can help the work of St George's Hospital by changing your existing Will. You can make minor alternations by using a codicil which is a formal addition to your existing Will. If, however, you are making extensive changes, you may need to make an entirely new Will.

Please don't try to change your existing Will by deleting or adding words. And don't make any attachments to your existing Will. This may make your existing Will invalid.

If you do wish to change your existing Will to leave a gift to St George's, we recommend the following wording:
